

- ◆ People who have to file a residence tax return: Those who live in Numazu City on the day of Jan. 1, 2015 and fall into any of the following cases below
- ①People who were sent a form from City Hall but don't have to pay income tax
- ②People who earned taxable income during 2014 but don't have to file a final income tax return (People whose total amount of extra income is less than 200,000 yen included.)
- ③People who receive a public pension and are going to file the deductions for National Health Insurance or life insurance premiums
- (4) People who pay the National Health Insurance and are not supported by others
- ⑤ People who don't earn taxable income during 2014 but need proof of earnings or a tax exemption certificate
- *People who have filed the final income tax return to the tax office and salaried workers who have already deducted from employment income in the year-end adjustment need not file the return.
- *People who will file the deductions of any insurance need to file the residence tax return even if you don't need to file a tax return.

- *Numazu Tax Office doesn't guide you in filling in a return form during the above period.
- *You need to pay 50 yen (every 30 minutes) for a parking space.

People who have to file an income tax return:

*The self-employed or people who get income from real estate, or sold their land or buildings: Their total amount of income for 2014 exceeds the total amount of income deduction like basic deduction or spouse allowance.

- *Salaried workers applicable to any of the following cases below
- ① People who earned more than 20 million yen a year.
- ② People who received income from two or more places.
- ③ People who earned more than 200,000 yen in extra income over the past year.
- *People whose income is only miscellaneous income from public pension, and have remains after income deduction
- *People whose amount of pension is less than 4 million yen, and miscellaneous income except pension is 200,000 yen don't need to file an income tax return. (They need to file a tax return for a residence tax.) *Please ask Tax Office about the details.

*What you should bring with you when filing a tax return

- ① *Inkan* (personal seal)
- ② The documents on which you added up your income and necessary expenses (like certificate of taxes deducted, detailed statement of receipts and payments, etc.)
- ③ The documents necessary for deduction from income
 - *Certification of premium payment for social insurance, small enterprise mutual aid plan, national pension, national health insurance, medical insurance for the elderly, nursing-care insurance, life insurance, earthquake insurance, etc.
 - **In case of filing a deduction for National Pension, a certificate sent from the Social Insurance Agency will be needed.

In Numazu city, ambulances were sent out 9,125 times in 2014, and the number of the people who were transported to hospital by ambulance was more than 9,000 for four consecutive years. Recently the number of inappropriate cases of calling an ambulance has been increasing and this could seriously jeopardize the chances to save lives

due to the delay of proper lifesaving measures.

◆ Never Call Ambulance for Any Reason of the Followings!!!

- · Because you think you might be able to see a doctor preferentially.
- · Because it cost you a lot to take a taxi to hospital.
- · Because you don't know any hospitals available at night or on holidays.
- Because you worry about your symptoms such as a bruise, a cut, or too much drunken though they might not be so serious.

Pay Attention to PM2.5 (Micro Particulate Substance)


PM2.5, which has a serious bad effect on health, tends to raise its density in the atmosphere from wintertime to springtime every year.

♦What is PM2.5?

PM2.5 is an under-2.5-micrometer particle which floats in the atmosphere. Its diameter is one-thirtieth as long as that of a single hair. According to an immunological survey, it has been

obvious that PM2.5 is easy to be inhaled into the deep bottom of lungs due to its small size and that it increases the risk of diseases in the respiratory system and the circulatory system.

**One micrometer is one-thousandth as long as 1 millimeter.



❖ How to inform people of the situation of high density of PM2.5 in the atmosphere


When the prefectural government announces "the information calling for attention to PM2.5" because the density of PM2.5 in the atmosphere is expected to rise up to and over the figure of harmful degree set by the national government as a tentative guideline, the information will be provided for people through each area's simultaneous radio transmission.

◆What to do if "the information calling for attention to PM2.5" has been announced

Those who have disorders in their respiratory system or their circulatory system, small children and elderly people need to pay more attention to PM2.5.

- •To refrain from going out if you don't have to.
- •To refrain from working or playing outdoors
- •To refrain from opening windows or turning on the fan for air ventilation.
- •To wear virus-proof masks or dust-proof masks that can deal with PM2.5 more effectively.

Refrain from going out if "the information calling for attention to PM2.52 has been announced.




◆Air Pollution Observation System in Shizuoka Prefecture


