Public Sewer - Financing Scheme for Early Connection

In areas where public sewerage is available, city ordinance requires that you connect to the public sewerage system within six months, so please connect as soon as possible. The city also has a financing scheme available.

- Eligibility: Properties with renovation work to flush toilets and drainage equipment construction to connect to public sewer system. (Excluding new construction)
- Financing amount: 50,000 yen 2,000,000 yen (The amount changes in units of 10,000. Within renovation cost)
- Term of repayment: Repay within 3 years if you received 500,000 yen or less, and within 5 years if you received more than 500,000 yen.
- *The city bears the interest if the construction is completed within 3 years from the start of the sewerage service.

Start and keep going—enjoy a fun and safe cycling life in Numazu!

Safety and cool cycling lecture

Enjoying a safe ride is the foundation of cycling. Let's take a moment to review the essential traffic rules and manners that can sometimes be overlooked.

NO Drinking and Riding.

The Road Traffic Law prohibits bicycle riding under the influence of alcohol. Driving under the influence of alcohol carries a penalty of up to three years in prison or a fine of up to ¥500,000. Offering alcohol to someone who will be riding a

Smartphones - Hands Off While Riding!

Using a smartphone or other devices or gazing at the screen while riding is prohibited. The penalty can be imprisonment for up to 6 months, or a fine of up to ¥100,000. This applies to both smartphones and cell phones.

Earphones Are Out; But humming is In.

It is tempting to listen to music while riding lightly on a bicycle, but using earphones while riding is prohibited. Humming is accepted but not too loud now.



Bicycles Are Light Vehicles and so are horses!

Bicycles are classified as light vehicles under Japanese traffic law. On roads with designated sidewalks and roadways, it is the general rule to ride on the left side of the roadway. Follow road signs and give priority to pedestrians. By the way, horses and rickshaws are also classified as light

Helmets are a Must.

Wearing helmets has been encouraged for all cyclists as a legal obligation to make an effort since April 2023. To protect your precious lives, the lives of others, cyclists, adults and children, must always wear a helmet when riding.



It's better to turn your lights on early.

Always turn on your lights when riding at night. In principle, lights should be attached to the front and rear of your bicycle. Wearing reflective materials on your clothing and body makes it easier for cars and pedestrians to see you in low light.

Raincoats are in! Umbrellas

Riding a bicycle while holding an umbrella on a rainy day is not only extremely dangerous. but illegal, with a fine of up to ¥50,000. You should consider wearing a raincoat or alternative transportation.



No side-by-side riding, even if you are close.

Riding alongside other bicycles is prohibited. Ride safely in a single file line, even if you are riding with friends or commuting together. Save your conversations for after you've safely arrived.

Shingles vaccine Now Included In Routine Vaccination

Shingles is a skin disease caused by the chickenpox virus that incubates in the body for a long period. When immunity is weakened - due to overwork or stress -the virus can resurface, causing a red, blistering rash in a band-like pattern, often accompanied by severe pain. Vaccination can help prevent both the onset and the severity of the disease.

- Eligibility: Those who will be 65,70,75,80,85,90,95, or 100 years old during the fiscal year 2025, and those who are 100 years old or older.
- **Vaccination fee:** Live vaccine=4,800 yen

Recombinant vaccine=12,000 yen

- Vaccination deadline: Tuesday, March 31, 2026
- *You are eligible to receive the routine vaccination only once in your lifetime.
- *Vaccination tickets were mailed to eligible individuals in late March. If you have lost or recently moved and have not received one, please contact us for assistance.

- *Units that have not been selected by anyone in the current round of applications will automatically be available.
- *You can apply without a guarantor.

- Temporarily be charged for all medical expenses
- No longer be able to be issued a certificate for ceiling-amount; same applies to Myna insurance card.
- Your workplace or business partnerships may become the subject of a financial investigation. The delinquent payments will cause actions such as seizure.
- Not be able to receive subsidy for medical checkups

- **Who:** People who enroll in the medical care system for the elderly, has completed the payment of the insurance premiums of last fiscal year, and were not selected for the grant last fiscal year.

- *If you have any implanted medical devices (pacemakers, cochlear imlants, etc.) or metals (implants, surgical clips, etc.) in your body, you may not be able to undergo a brain checkup. Please consult with your doctor.

Earthquakes can strike at any time. Take steps to protect yourself, your family, and your property? The city offers support for earthquake preparedness.

Free Furniture Fastening

In past earthquakes, including the recent one in the Noto Peninsula. Ishikawa prefecture, furniture tipping over has caused much damage and injuries. Furniture such as wardrobes and refrigerators can topple over and cause not only injury but also hinder prompt evacuation. To help residents stay safe, the city offers free furniture fastening service, including both installation and hardware fees.

The city does not move furniture or remove hardware once they are installed.

If you live in rental housing, you may need permission from the landlord and other relevant parties before installation.

Eligible households for Assistance

- Households consisting only of elderly persons aged 65 and over (If there is a person under 18 years old in the same household, it is still eligible)
- Households including persons at least one person who meets any of the following criteria:
 - ① Holds a physical disability certificate
 - ② Holds a rehabilitation certificate
 - 3 Holds a mental health and welfare certificate
 - ④ Receives a disability welfare pension or basic disability pension, or is eligible to receive one
 - (5) Certified as requiring nursing care or support
 - ⑥ Holds a specified medical expenses recipient certificate or a specified disease medical recipient certificate
 - Single-mother household

Defined as a household consisting of a mother and children under 18 years old. (Household with a person over 65 years old in the same household are also eligible)

Eligible furniture, etc for assistance


Up to 4 items per household are eligible, such as wardrobes, bookshelves, refrigerator, cupboards, etc.


*Does not include door opening/closing prevention. This will be available to those who wish, at a cost.

Subsidy Installation Cost of Seismic Breakers

To prevent electrical fires after an earthquake, breakers must be shut off during an evacuation. Seismic breakers are effective devices that shut off electricity after an earthquake to prevent electrical fires that may occur when power is restored. Please use the subsidy for the installation of seismic breakers to prevent earthquakes and fire in your home.

Eligible Equipment





A sensor built into or retrofitted to the distribution board detects earthquake shaking and shuts off electricity by dropping the breaker.

- *Outlet type and simple type are not eligible for the subsidy.
- *This subsidy applies to those who have the structure and functions of a residential distribution board with seismic sensing function (JWDS0007 Attachment 2), which is a standard set by the Japan Wiring Systems Industries Association (JWISA).



• **Eligibility:** Individuals who intend to install a seismic breaker in the following residences.

Type of Housing	Subsidy Amount
Residence in the city that you own or live in (Owner's approval is required for rental housing.)	Two-third of the equipment purchase and installation cost, and up to a maximum of ¥30,000 (rounded down to the nearest thousand yen)
Residence in the city that is newly built for you to live.	¥10,000

- **How to apply:** Individuals who wish to apply in person or by mail using an application form along with the necessary documents. The form is available at the Crisis Management Division on the 5th floor of City Hall, each district centre, the city library, or on the city website.
- Application deadline: The application closes when the budget limit is reached
- *Please visit the city website for application status and details
- *Application is limited once per household.
- *Electrical work is required to install the seismic breaker. Please request an electrician for a quote.
