The warship named “Diana” with Mr. Puchartin on board who came to Japan for the trade contract with Japan was hit by tsunami around Tagono Ura. The ship builders living around Heda port built a western type of ship instead of Diana, then the Mr. Puchartin could return to Russia.

35 Museum of ship building materials collected from local areas



The remains of the warship “Diana” and the records of Heda shipbuilding are displayed and the goods discovered in the Mastue old tomb can be seen. Furthermore, in the museum of deep sea fishes, many specimens of deep-sea fish are also displayed.

36 Hot Spring of Heda-Ichinoyu



The public hot-spring called Ichino-yu was discovered in 1986. Its hot water is drinkable and good for skin diseases and neuralgia. There is a stand where you enjoy the water with ease.

37 Rice paddies of Kitayama



Strange and rare rice paddies along the slope of a hill. In fall, a rice crop contest is usually held there.
