## 9 Senbon Matsubara



The beach line extends 10km and has been selected as one of the most beautiful scenes (100). These pine trees were replanted by a famous priest (Zoyo Syonin) after those had been cut off by the war between the Takeda and Hojo clans, almost 100 years ago.

## 9 Literary Monuments along Senbon Beach



The fact that there still remain many monuments are evidence of how much those writers loved this beach. For example, a famous writer, Yasushi Inoue published so many of his works when he was young in this beach. And also Bokusui Wakayama, a famous poet has left so many poems. His 1st monument located at Senbon Matsubara beach, his grave in Jyounji

temple and his memorial are also visited by many tourists.

## 10 Huge Water Gate named “View-o” at Numazu Port



The largest water gate in Japan built by Shizuoka, Prefecture was designed to prevent Tsunami. From the top of the water gate, 30m high, you can enjoy the panorama view of Mt. Fuji and Suruga Bay.

The gate is always lightened up.

Open hours: 10:00-21:00 hours weekdays except Tue.

Admission Fee: ¥100- for an adult, ¥50- for a child

## 11 Fish market and Dinning street in Numazu



You can enjoy all tasty and fresh fish, particular near to the fish market.

## 12 Ganyudo Ferryboat



The ferry, once suspended, has been restored, and runs between the port and the downtown, Ganyudo. Also the ferry route called Ayumi Bridge has now come into operation, so you can go up to the upper end of the Kano River.

## 13 Numazu Villa Park of the Imperial Families

The villa built in 1893 has been used by the Imperial families from Meiji to Showa emperor days. It was refined and



reopened in 1969 since it had been abandoned by them.

Through the beautiful park and the old architectural houses, you can see how the imperial families lived.
